#### 1. Births and Deaths (6)

- For every 100 girl babies who die in the first 27 days of life 125 boy babies die.
- For every 100 girl babies who die after the first 27 days but in the first year of life 127 boy babies die.
- For every 100 girls ages 1 to 4 years who die 126 boys die.
- For every 100 girls ages 5 to 14 years who die 133 boys die.
- For every 100 girls and women ages 15 to 24 years who die 280 boys and men die.
- For every 100 women ages 25 to 34 who die 232 men die.

## 2. Special Education (7)
