Cyberbullying

- Among high school students, 15.5% are cyberbullied and 20.2% are bullied on school property (Center for Disease Control, 2017).
- The percentages of individuals who have experienced cyberbullying at some point in their lifetimes have nearly doubled (18% to 34%) from 2007-2016 (Patchin & Hinduja, 2016).
- 90% of teens who report being cyberbullied have also been bullied offline (<u>"Seven Fears and the Science of How Mobile Technologies May Be Influencing Adolescents in the Digital Age," George and Odgers, 2015</u>).
- 23% of students who reported being cyberbullied notified an adult at school about the incident (National Center for Educational Statistics, 2016).
- Only 40–50% of cyberbullying targets are aware of the identity of the perpetrator (Patchin & Hinduja, 2016).
- Those who are cyberbullied are also likely to be bullied offline (Hamm, Newton, & Chisholm, 2015).
